FDIC ANNOUNCES A NEW RESOURCE FOR COMMUNITY BANKS: AFFORDABLE MORTGAGE LENDING GUIDE, PART II: STATE HOUSING FINANCE AGENCIES

Summary: The Affordable Mortgage Lending Guide, Part II (Guide), describes programs offered by State Housing Finance Agencies across the country. The Guide focuses on first-lien mortgage products, down payment and closing assistance, mortgage tax credit certificates, and homeownership education and counseling programs that can facilitate mortgage lending by insured depository institutions.
